- Please pray for all the trustees on 18th July, as they meet again. Lord give them wisdom and discernment in all decisions for the charity, that their meeting is productive with no technical issues.
- We pray also for the SIFT community, that they have not been too affected by the virus and that they also get back on track soon in Nicaragua, helping the communities under their care.
- Please Pray for Carolyn Gibbs and her health, we pray for the correct treatment and a positive outcome and good recovery.

Nicaragua

- Please pray also for Valeria, who throughout the year has to complete paper work for her NGO
 to continue in Nicaragua, we hope it goes through again without problem. We are so thankful
 for her sister and brother in law, although not completely recovered are feeling much better
 and release Valeria to do other things. We hope they return to full health. We hope Valeria
 remains well and we ask for strength and peace for her and her family Lord.
- We give thanks for Yadira and her family and their continuing good health, we pray also for protection for her family in these difficult times.
- Pray still for the people of Nicaragua. We hear that the peak infection rate has not yet arrived in Central America: if that's true, the impact will simply add to the numbers turned away by the

country's staggering health-system, failing under a severe overload. Pray also for those working in the health care system without the resources to handle the virus and even to protect themselves. Government and Minsa (Health Care Dept) and the hospitals constantly disagreeing on numbers affected, there is no clear information.

- Pray for the economic situation in Nicaragua, especially the poorest communities who always suffer. Pray that more support for the country comes from their Government. Please let all the utilities continue, that people can find work and bring food to their families.
- Pray for the community of San Sebastián as they wait for the build, which will be next year now
 and prepare to work with the team to transform their school for generations to come. We pray
 that this will be able to be done very soon.
- We pray for a continuation of the school links developed between English and Nicaraguan schools
 to bring about Cross cultural learning plus future awareness and fund raising. We pray these
 continue to benefit the children on both sides.
- Give thanks also for the re-opening of Casa Rahab in Granada. The girls have been suffering
 during the suspension of our activities there. Pray that the mitigating actions provided by Valeria
 will keep them and the staff safe from infection. She has an impressive array of masks and visors,
 and is providing transport to minimise the staff's exposure on the very crowded buses out to
 Granada.
- Please give thanks for recent news of a reduction in electricity tariffs in Nicaragua the result of lower oil prices perhaps, but still welcome.
- We pray that the Sahara dust storm carried over every year at this time does not add to the breathing problems of the people in the country and put extra strain on the hospitals with Covid.
- We pray for Margaret Storey who is still in Bluefields helping to distribute food and helping out in schools. Amazing lady, who declined the flight home to stay and help out, we hope you stay well and get back to the UK safely at some point.
- Pray for the communities in Kara, Karawala, Sandy Bay and La Barra. Kenji reports that the
 communities are doing all they can to help one another but the virus has fallen on these
 communities who have virtually no healthcare.
