

Christmas lunch on Jesus (CLOJ) is a seasonal initiative to deliver quality food hampers to individuals, families and homes in our community who would otherwise struggle to provide a Christmas lunch for their family this Christmas. Last year we made a huge difference to local people by sponsoring, packing and delivering hampers to members of our community who are in desperate need at this time of year. The hampers are packed with Christmas goodies including a turkey, stuffing, carrots, brussel sprouts, potatoes and gravy. If you are able to sponsor the cost of a hamper this year they are £35 each, so please do add you name to the sheet if you are able to support this fantastic initiative and help give a Merry Christmas to those who need it the most.

#### Packing day = Friday 20 December:

Hundreds of volunteers will gather at Tolworth Recreation Centre in order to get the items in the hamper. We'd love to have you with us - it's a fantastic atmosphere, lots of Christmas jumpers and chances to chat.

#### **Delivery Day = Saturday 21 December:**

Pairs of volunteers will deliver hampers to the clients doorstep, most hampers are delivered between 8am and midday. It's a wonderful way to start Christmas proper - reminding people that they are not alone and sharing the joy of Christmas together.
